What is involved?

The award of Chartered Manager is based on the practical application of your skills and expertise in leading people and managing change. It is a streamlined process, completed over 10-15 hours, designed to fit in with your professional life. Study for the award comprises:

1. A written submission.
2. A telephone interview.

The role of TFL Education

TFL Education provides a Chartered **Fellow** assessment route to Chartered Manager. This process:

- Assigns you a personal coach to work with you on your submission
- Provides you with the opportunity to reflect on your skills and qualities
- Confirms competence and professionalism at both operational and strategic levels
- Validates your impact through leading people and managing change

Eligibility for the **Fellowship** assessment route requires a degree level qualification or above in management* and 10 years management experience with at least 3 at strategic level. To assess suitability for Fellowship, applicants must submit a TFL Application Form and CV.

* NPQH is an approved qualification.
